Read Isaiah 9:1. Why is the word "nevertheless" significant in this passage? Do you pay attention to these kinds of pivot words when you are reading the Bible on your own? Why or why not?

Read Isaiah 9:1-3. How is God speaking through this passage of Scripture into your present circumstances?

Read Isaiah 9:1-7. How does the context of this famous Christmas passage (v.6) help you to better understand the promise of the coming of Jesus?

WHAT IS MY INITIAL REACTION?

Take a closer look at **Isaiah 9:6**. Which of the titles of the Messiah most resonate with you from this passage? Why?

Reflect on this quote from the message as a group: "One of the clearest characteristics of people who follow God should be our ability to rely on His promises, no matter what's going on around us." - Caleb Baker

WHAT AM I GOING TO DO?

How is God calling you, specifically, to "live in the nevertheless?"

Read Acts 1:6-11. Where in your life do you need to shift from waiting to anticipating?
